At its core, code enforcement is how local governments ensure that rules around buildings, property maintenance, and land use are followed. These rules are designed to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of all residents.

Here's what code enforcement typically covers:

Zoning – Making sure land is used appropriately

Building – Preventing unpermitted or unsafe construction

Nuisance & Environmental – Addressing issues like overgrown grass, junk, or illegal dumping

Licensing – Ensuring required permits and business licenses are obtained

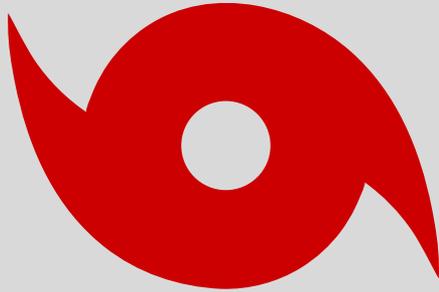

HURRICANE TIPS

- 1. Create an Emergency Kit:** Ensure you have the essentials: bottled water, non-perishable food, medications, a first-aid kit, flashlights, batteries, and important documents in a waterproof container.
- 2. Have a Plan:** Know your evacuation routes and establish a communication plan with family and friends.
- 3. Secure Your Home:** Reinforce windows and doors. Bring outdoor furniture, decorations, and trash bins indoors to prevent damage or injury.
- 4. Stay Informed:** Sign up for our emergency alert system, **CodeRed**, to receive real-time updates. Monitor trusted sources such as the National Weather Service and local news outlets.
- 5. Check Insurance Coverage:** Ensure your home and belongings are adequately insured.
- 6. Stay Informed:** Make sure your home and property insurance is up to date and provides adequate coverage for hurricane-related damage.
- 7. Fuel Up:** Make sure your car's gas tank is full, and have extra fuel for generators.
- 8. Backup Power:** Consider a generator for power outages and know how to use it safely.

SeeClickFix is an easy-to-use platform that allows residents to notify the City about local concerns anytime, anywhere.

How It Works:

- Visit richmondhill-ga.gov and click on "SeeClickFix Requests"
- Or download the SeeClickFix app on the App Store or Google Play

Submitting a Request Is Simple:

- Snap a photo
- Provide a brief description and location of the issue
- Submit – anonymously if you prefer!

Once submitted, your report is routed directly to the appropriate City department. You can track the status of your request and receive updates along the way.
